Feedback and Suggestion of Students

1. Students suggested improving the teaching learning process.
2. To provide facilities of ICT tools like projector in each classroom.
3. To increase number of smart class for each discipline.
4. Undergraduate programs should be conducted in sections to decrease classroom student teacher ratio.
5. Seating capacity of Laboratories must be enhanced for undergraduate programs.
6. Computer laboratory must have updated computer systems and proportionate to enrolled students.
7. Chemicals and instruments are not provided as per requirement.
8. Students demand for new skill development courses, Vocational courses, Diploma courses and post graduation program in Geography.
9. There should be appointment of Assistant Professors and Professors against vacant post. The number of sanctioned post for Assistant Professors should be increased.
10. There is a shortage of classrooms for postgraduate and some undergraduate programs.
11. There is a shortage of furniture in the classrooms.
12. Proper sanitation facilities for common room and boy's toilet. At least toilets must be cleaned within each 3 hour of use.
13. There should be special classes for preparation of Competitive exams.
14. Placement camps should be organized at regular interval.
15. Students suggested increasing number of office counters for their convenience.
16. Many students suggested promoting and maintaining disciplined environment in the campus.



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Actions taken on feedback/Suggestions of Students

1. Students suggested improving the teaching learning process.

The teaching-learning process has improved effectively by formulating well planned time table, regular classes by dedicated faculty, appointing experienced Guest Lecturers and Janbhagidari teachers, proper monitoring of classes by Principal and HOD's, increased classroom facilities, teaching ICT tools and library facilities.

2. To provide facilities of ICT tools like projector in each classroom.

All departments having post graduation programs have allotted a computer system and projectors. Now Under each Graduation Program, departments have provided ICT tools like Computer system, Projectors, Sound system, Mikes.

3. To increase number of smart class for each discipline.

There is only one smart class. But computer laboratory, Botany department and Zoology department have internet/ wifi connectivity and ICT tools for teaching-learning process.

4. Undergraduate programs should be conducted in sections to decrease classroom student teacher ratio.

All under graduate programs have more than 200 enrollments and the student-teacher ratio is not appropriate. To compensate this ratio, halls with large seating capacity i.e., about 200 students, have provided ICT tools like Computer system, Projectors, Sound system, Mikes.

5. Seating capacity of Laboratories must be enhanced for undergraduate programs.

All laboratories have extended and well equipped with instruments. Construction of some new laboratories is under consideration.

6. Computer laboratory must have updated computer systems and proportionate to enrolled students.

New computer labs and updated computers have introduced in computer department. Computer systems have been regularly updated and repaired in case of any complaint.

7. Chemicals and instruments are not provided as per requirement.



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The laboratories were provided new chemicals and instruments as per requirement yearly. In fact there is a regular enhancement in allotted seats for admission in different programs.

8. *Students demand for new skill development courses, Vocational courses, Diploma courses and post graduation program in Geography.*

Since 2021-22, value added Courses have started. In session 2023-24 VAC on “Vermiculture & vermicomposting” and “Gardening in Limited area” has conducted. Diploma course and post graduate diploma course in computer has started. The opening of pradhan mantri kaushal vikas yojana has been under process. The proposal for post graduation program in Geography has submitted.

9. *There should be appointment of Assistant Professors and Professors against vacant post. The number of sanctioned post for Assistant Professors should be increased.*

The proposal for increasing number of sanctioned post of Assistant Professors has submitted. Meanwhile Guest Lecturers and Janbhagidari, Self finance teachers have appointed.

10. *There is a shortage of classrooms for postgraduate and some undergraduate programs.*

To compensate this shortage the classes of postgraduate and some undergraduate programs have allotted different time slot for their lectures.

11. *There is a shortage of furniture in the classrooms.*

Furniture is purchased as per allocated budget at first priority.

12. *Proper sanitation facilities for common room and boy's toilet. At least toilets must be cleaned within each 3 hour of use.*

To improve sanitation facilities a new sweeper has appointed and instructed for proper sanitation practice.

13. *There should be special classes for preparation of Competitive exams.*

A special class for preparation of state Public Service Commission exam has conducted under supervision of Principal and guidance of District



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Collector Rajnandgaon. Few webinars on preparation of competitive exams and career guidance classes have organized.

14. Placement camps should be organized at regular interval.

Placement camps were organized annually.

15. Students suggested increasing number of office counters for their convenience.

During admission, exam form or any mass submission the number office counters were increased. More Non-teaching staff were engaged for the purpose.

16. Many students suggested promoting and maintaining disciplined environment in the campus.

There is a working Disciplinary committee of Assistant Professors to monitor and maintain disciplined environment in the campus.



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Feedback/Suggestions of Guardians

1. To establish relationship with local community for collaborative initiatives in development of the college.
2. To increase the productivity and research work.
3. Teachers must engrained students personality and future by their quality education.
4. The office counter should facilitate chairs for students.
5. Guardians suggested organizing regular extra-curricular and cultural activities.
6. Students of all courses could access the computer lab and basic knowledge of computer.
7. Appointment of Sports coach to provide equal opportunity to all students. Sports facilities and activities are limited.
8. To provide adequate number of classrooms with seating capacity of allotted seats.
9. There is no separate classroom and department for students of post graduation.
10. Laboratories with adequate seating capacity and quantity of chemicals.
11. There is a need of more specimens and microscope in Zoology Lab.
12. Common room and wash room must be cleaned twice a day.
13. Time table for computer classes are not appropriate.
14. Library could issue 3-4 books at a time. The management of library should be improved.
15. To avail more reference books for PG students.
16. To start vocational courses and organize career counseling classes for each course.
17. To enhance student-teacher relationship.
18. To make a helpdesk for scholarship issues.
19. Guardian suggested providing water cooler during summer.
20. All teachers should use projectors as teaching aids. Many guardians suggested improving the quality of projectors.
21. Many guardians emphasized on appointment of more Assistant Professors.
22. The availability of furniture as per students enrolled.



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Actions taken on feedback/Suggestions of Guardians

- i. The research committee and many other committees have established to promote student's productivity and research practice.
- ii. The Janbhagidari committee, IQAC etc., committees have chairperson and members who were selected among the local community.
- iii. Teachers are experienced and dedicated to their job and work under supervision of the Principal.
- iv. The college management is continuously going through paper work to higher authorities to get new sanctioned post in each course.
- v. The NSS unit, NCC unit and all Departments organize different extra-curricular activities at regular basis.
- vi. The college organizes different cultural activities through Youth festival, departmental activities and annual function each year.
- vii. To compensate the shortage of class rooms all PG courses has been scheduled to second shift in the time table.
- viii. The computer department runs DCA & PGDCA courses so that students of other streams could also get computer basics & advance knowledge.
- ix. Now the office facilitates chairs for the students.
- x. The college has received one more water cooler from a philanthropist.
- xi. The college management has made proposal to construct laboratories with adequate seating capacity.
- xii. To improve sanitation facilities a new sweeper has appointed and instructed for proper sanitation practice.
- xiii. The proposal for increasing number of sanctioned post of Assistant Professors has submitted. Meanwhile Guest Lecturers and Janbhagidari Self finance teachers have appointed.
- xiv. The opening of pradhan mantri kaushal vikas yojana has been under process.
- xv. The laboratories were provided new chemicals and instruments as per requirement yearly. In fact there is a regular enhancement in allotted seats for admission in different programs.
- xvi. There is a sports officer post in the college but this post is still vacant. So a care taker has been appointed from the college fund.
- xvii. In Library, KOHA software is installed. The online public access and on demand service is also available. Library is continuously extending with



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rooms and reference books. The Library has N-List membership and provides online content, books and study materials to the students.

- xviii. All laboratories are well equipped after utilizing RUSA fund.
- xix. The office staff was dealing the issues of scholarship.
- xx. All teachers get instruction to use projectors as teaching aids.

Feedback/Suggestions of Alumni

- i. Shortage of class rooms, furniture.
- ii. Separate Botany laboratory room for UG program is required.
- iii. The Boy's toilet has no proper sanitation and water supply. The boys also damage the toilet and do not flush after use.
- iv. Regular competitive classes, vocational course and motivational classes should be organized.
- v. Suggested to provide smart board in each class room.
- vi. Many Alumni emphasized on appointment of more Assistant Professors.




